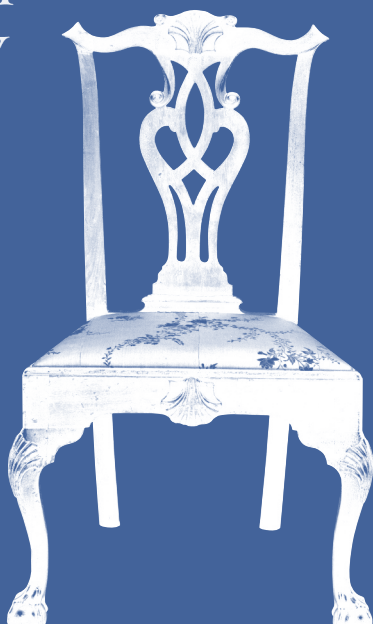

**Gil Schafer III**

Honorary Chair of the Delaware Antiques Show, award-winning architect Gil Schafer III is the founder of internationally acclaimed G. P. Schafer Architect, PLLC. An *Architectural Digest* AD 100 member, Schafer is consistently recognized as one of the world's experts on contemporary classical architecture. The grandson and great-great-grandson of architects, Schafer grew up with the strong sense of how a well-built, thoughtfully designed home can bring pleasure to daily life. From 1999 to 2006, Schafer



served as the president and then chairman of the Institute of Classical Architecture & Classical America. His work and firm's projects have been widely featured in publications in the U.S. and abroad, including *Architectural Digest*, *Elle Décor*, *House Beautiful*, *Veranda*, the *New York Times*, and the *Wall Street Journal*. Schafer is also a noted author. His best-selling *The Great American House: Tradition for the Way We Live Now* blends classical architecture,

interior decoration, and landscape to create homes with a feeling of history. His latest book, *A Place to Call Home: Tradition, Style, and Memory in the New American House*, will premiere in late September. *Book signing to follow lecture. Included with admission.*
